We read the story of 'Winnie in Space' and constructed our own rocket using rods and made 3-d shape rockets in art!




In English we played an oral language barrier game to work on the Space vocabulary we learned and pre-positional language eg, 'Put the small green spaceship in the middle.' etc.



We watched the first 'Moon Landing' from National geographic kids as part of our S.E.S.E. lesson. Watch it here:



What an exciting start 4th class has had to November as they engaged in lots of different activities.

















Junior Infants - Ms. Doyle
